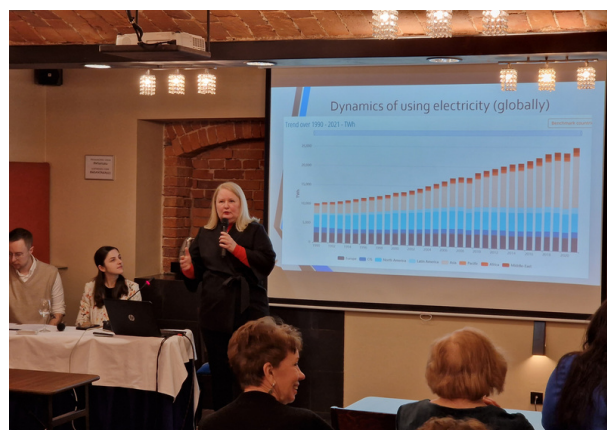

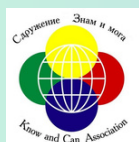

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TOPICS OF THE PRESENTATIONS DURING CONFERENCE

Guest speakers:

- Creativity in education (by Vaiva Zuzevičiūtė, prof. Dr. H.B., Mykolas Romeris University)

The speaker raised important topics related to creativity, its importance for economy, society and how it changes currently and will change in the future.

- Lifelong learning: Non-formal adult education in Lithuania (by Loreta Montrimaitė, Kaunas District Education Center methodologist-coordinator of non-formal adult education, Lithuania)

The speaker presented main legislation and financial structures of lifelong learning in Lithuania as well as raised multiple questions for discussion on organising non-formal adult education.

PARTICIPANTS FEEDBACK

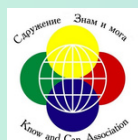
